This historic out-and-back course begins at the base of Brady Street Hill, featuring live bands, enthusiastic crowds, and a chance to “Run with the Best” alongside Olympic medalists and elite athletes including legends Joan Benoit Samuelson and Bill Rodgers. Starting at the Mississippi River and ending with the Midwest’s biggest post-race party, the Bix 7 is more than just a race – it’s an unforgettable celebration of community, competition, and fun!

2011 was the introduction of The Eloise Caldwell Trophy awarded to the “Fastest Female Quad-Citizen” in the Bix 7 mile; Dan Hayes was instrumental in growing the Bix 7 to national prominence. In his honor a bronze statue was added to the Bix Plaza

2012 the Brady Street Sprint event is renamed “Battle up Brady”, and the Quad City Bank and Trust “Corporate Challenge” was added

2013 the Premier Buick GMC Dealers will award \$1,000 to the High School with the first Iowa or Illinois male and female high school runner to cross the Bix 7 finish line

2014 Celebrated American Pride by inviting all active duty US military to enter the Bix 7 for FREE! Bix 7 established a charity benefiting late-term hospice care for veterans.

2015 “Race for the Jackpot” was rebranded to “BEAT THE ELITE”

2016 “Battle up Brady” was rebranded to “BRADY STREET SPRINTS”

2017 hosted the fifth USA Track & Field National Championship

2019 Ed Froehlich retires after his 40-year run as race director

2020 was held virtually due to the global pandemic. 3,500 racers competed from all 50 states and seven different countries.

2022 marked the first Caesar's Sportsbook Team Challenge. Running teams from across the country raced for Bix 7 supremacy with over \$5,000 in cash prizes.

2023 was a USATF National Championship race

2024 marked the 50th running of the Bix 7. Race day saw a stark increase in runners on a beautiful Saturday morning. The inaugural Bechel Trusts Senior Bix was held with over 1,100 participants age 50 and older.



The Quad-City Times Bix 7 is one of the largest non-marathon prize purses in the U.S.! Over \$65,000 in cash will be awarded.

Premier Buick Dealers will present the same prize structure for both men and women in the open category. 1st = \$12,500, 2nd = \$4,000, 3rd = \$2,500, 4th = \$1,500, 5th = \$1,000, 6th = \$900, 7th = \$800, 8th = \$700, 9th = \$600 and 10th = \$500

Special awards are presented to the top 10 finishers for both men's and women's age divisions. Special awards are also presented to the top three Masters Division (40 & over) finishers for both men and women.



Age group award categories are: 15 and under, 16-19, 20-24, 25-29, 30-34, 35-39, etc., ending with the 80 and over category. Each category will be 1st through 5th place for both men and women. Age group award ceremony will be 11 a.m. at Toasted, located near the start line at 4th and Perry Streets.

The Greg Newell Trophy will be presented to the fastest male Quad-Citian. The first male Quad-Citian who crosses the Bix 7 finish line will receive the Trophy.

The Eloise Caldwell Trophy will be presented to the fastest female Quad-Citian. The first female Quad-Citian who crosses the Bix 7 finish line will receive the Trophy.

“The High School Challenge” The first Iowa or Illinois male and female high school runner to cross the Bix7 finish line will receive a \$1,000 check for their high school from Premier Buick GMC Dealers.

Premiere Buick GMC Dealers “First Responders Challenge” Which Quad City first responder team is the fastest? 6-member, co-ed teams from Fire, EMS/Medic, Sheriff and Police departments compete over the 7-mile course. Top three teams will win cash prizes for their departments. In appreciation for stepping forward at the hardest moments, race entry fees will be waived.

New this year, the first male and female first responders will receive \$500 cash prize.

Nancy Kapheim – All City Challenge

Nancy Kapheim was one of the driving forces behind the Bix 7 in its first three decades of existence. She is one of only two runners to have a Bix bib number retired in her honor.

Nancy Kapheim was the long-time President of the Cornbelt Running Club and the assistant Race Director of the Bix 7 at the time of her death, just a few days short of her 56th birthday in 2002. She was one of the founders and leading advocates of the Bix at Six training runs and a solid runner in her own right. She won the race's Women's Masters Championship in 1987.



After her death, the number 23 was retired, signifying the number of Bix 7's in which she had run.

All-City Challenge: Fastest in the QCA!

Which city runs the Bix 7 the fastest? In 2022, Davenport won the “All City Challenge.” The award is compiled by taking the 5 fastest men and women from each city. These times are divided by 10 to get the average time of all 10 runners from each city. This determines the fastest city. The Scott County Regional Authority presents the traveling “Nancy Kapheim Memorial Trophy” to the winning city’s mayor.

Our Beat the Elite athletes will be given the opportunity to race and beat the overall winner of the Quad-City Times Bix 7 road race. The person(s) selected will be given a head start, 2-3 miles, possibly more, depending on the needed handicap to make the event competitive. If the chosen runner "breaks the tape" to the finish line, he or she will win ...\$2,500!

Event Results

- 2004** Tim Delf was outkicked by winner John Korir despite a 2.4 mile head start. He ran 32:49 and lost by 13 seconds.
- 2005** Janelle Swanberg cruised to a \$3,100 jackpot, 31:41 with a 2.4 mile head start to beat Gilbert Okari by 43 seconds.
- 2006** David Ramp won \$3,200, beating race winner Lawrence Kiprotich by 12 seconds. Time of 32:01, after a 2.7 mile head start.
- 2007** Christy Lazaridis won \$3,300, beating race winner Duncan Kibet by 1:18, finishing in 30:57 with a 2.7 mile head start.
- 2008** Ben Houtikier was beaten to the finish line by 13 runners. With a 2 mile head start, he finished in 34:25.
- 2009** Ben Lloyd won \$3,500 with a time of 32:17 and a .9 mile head start. He finished 8 seconds in front of Meb Keflezighi.
- 2010** Ashley Kamba won by crossing the finish line nearly 2 ½ minutes ahead of Ryan Hall taking home \$3,600.
- 2011** Jim Irwin crossed the finish line 26 seconds before the Kenyans to take home \$3,700.
- 2012** Bob Madison was beaten by two runners, finished in 32.37. The Board & Rhythm City Casino decided to donate \$2,500 to his charity to construct a house in Haiti.
- 2013** Brock DeToye finished 1st in 31.35 ahead of Men's champion Leonard Korir of Kenya, taking home \$2,500.
- 2014** Kathy Schmitt finished 1st in 31.20, 27 seconds ahead of the winner Sean Quigley, taking home the Jackpot of \$2,500.

2015 Travis Allen never reached the finish line. With a lead he collapsed from heat exhaustion 3 blocks from the Finish Line.

2016 Nancy Van Hemert 31:32 and Corporate Runner Mark Rodgers 30:47 crossed the finish line ahead of the Elite winner Silas Kipruto. Both donated to Charity their Jackpot Prize.

2017 Joy Ripslinger won with a time of 31:06. She donated the prize to the Assumption track team and Brittany's Gifts.

2018 Bob Beardsley finished ahead of race winner Belay Tilahun with a time of 30:45. He donated the prize money.

2019 Mallory Asbe went neck to neck with winner Leonard Barsoton before needing assistance to cross the finish line.

2021 Doug Boleyn was passed by the elite pack just after making the turn from Brady Street onto 3rd Street. He finished in 33:55.

2022: Olivia Moore and Sam Russell were selected as participants in the Russell Break the Tape competition and they finished well ahead of the field to each win \$2,500.

2023: Kelly Grubbs and Nathan Windt were the first to cross the finish line, each winning \$2,500 and beating the Elite runners.

2024: Colin Cartee and Grace Boleyn successfully beat the overall elite winner. Cartee donated his winnings to GiGi's Playhouse of the Quad Cities, and Boleyn to Pleasant Valley running programs.

Brady Street Sprints

It's an uphill Sprint! Are you up for the Brady Street Sprints?

The race is exactly a quarter mile climb, steeply ascending up Brady Street hill. Nine races highlight the evening. Two men's and women's 'open' races (29 and under and 39 and under for each), two Masters' Races (40+ men's and womens'), High School relays (boys and girls), and the Bix 7 Sponsors Race (Bix sponsors only). The finals will be televised on KWQC with cash prizes for the top finishers. Time trials take place during three Bix @ 6 training runs - 7 pm at 5th and Pershing Street. The top 3 finishers each night will make it into the final round, which will take place at 7:00 pm on Thursday, July 24, 2025.

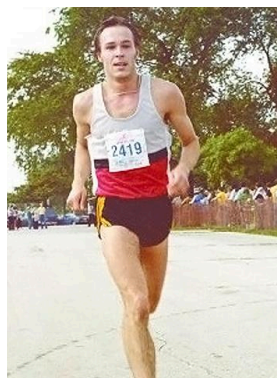

The Gregg Newell Award

The Gregg Newell Award was established in 2009 by the Bix 7 race committee. Gregg Newell is the only Quad-Cities resident ever to have won the annual race through the streets of Davenport. He was a standout runner at the Davenport Central High School, winning a State Championship in the mile run in 1972. At the University of Iowa, he once ran the mile in 4:01 and in the years following Graduation he found great success in his hometown race. He finished second in the Bix 7 in both 1977 and 1978, and finally won it in 1979 by the second largest margin in history – 53 seconds.



He passed away suddenly in 1989, prompting Bix Officials to retire Bib number 5, honoring the fact that Newell won the race in its fifth year of existence.

In 2011 Executive Race Director, Ed Froehlich announced that the Bix 7 would include a new award named in honor of local and nationally ranked masters runner and Bix 7 volunteer, Eloise Caldwell. The Caldwell Trophy will go to the top female finisher from the Quad-Cities in the race. In 2009 the event included the Gregg Newell Trophy for the top local male finisher, but Froehlich said he thought it was important to have a companion award for women. “I can’t think of anyone better we could recognize to represent all the female runners in the Quad-Cities,” Froehlich said. Eloise Caldwell, was one of just three women to run in the inaugural Bix race in 1975. She also has been a 4 time Bix 7 Women’s Master’s Champion.

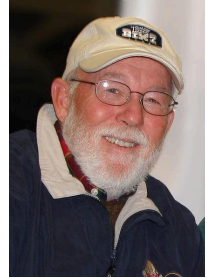

Ed Froehlich

Ed Froehlich became the Bix 7 race director in 1980 and oversaw its growth from a modest event with a few hundred runners into the largest and most prestigious non-marathon road race in the Midwest. Under his direction, the race grew to more than 20,000 entries with features such as the Jr. Bix 7, the Quick Bix and the Brady St. Challenge.



Froehlich was honored as the National Race Director of the year by Road Race Management in 1993. In 2005, he won the Fred Lebow Award for lifetime contributions to the sport of road racing and also was installed in Running USA's Hall of Champions. He was inducted into the Quad-City Sports Hall of Fame in 1998. In 2010, a statue bearing his likeness was added to Bix Plaza, commemorating his 30th year as Director of the Bix 7. In 2019, after 40 years as race director, Froehlich retired after the 45th running of the race.

Joan Benoit Samuelson

No one has won more Bix 7 Championships than Joan Benoit Samuelson. The Maine native and former Bowdoin College runner has won the women's race four times and has won the Women's Masters Trophy seven times. She has run the Bix 7 a total of 24 times starting in 1983.



Samuelson is widely regarded as the best women's distance runner in American history. She won the inaugural Olympic marathon for women in 1984 and is a former World Record-Holder in both the marathon and half-marathon. She also is a member of the USA Track and Field Hall of Fame. Samuelson was immortalized with her friend, Bill Rodgers, with a statue in Bix Plaza in 1999, in conjunction with the race's 25th Anniversary.

Bill Rodgers

Bill Rodgers was the greatest marathoner in the world when he first entered the Bix 7 in 1980. He has competed in the race every year since. Rodgers won the race in both 1980 and 1981, and has set several age group records in the event.



He also has won 22 Marathons in his career, including four victories in the Boston Marathon and four in the New York City Marathon between 1975 and 1980, and has won hundreds of other road races. He is a member of the USA Track and Field Hall of Fame and the Long Distance Running Hall of Fame. A statue of Rodgers and fellow Bix legend Joan Benoit Samuelson was erected in Bix Plaza in 1999, in conjunction with the race's 25th Anniversary.

Meb Keflezighi

Meb Keflezighi is one of the most accomplished marathoners in the World, as well as an All Time top US runner at various distances.



Meb has run Bix 10 times with victories in 2002 and 2009. He has been in the top ten Open Division 8 times and won the Masters Division in 2015 finishing with the 3rd fastest Masters time ever. He is a 4 time Olympian and was the Silver Medal medalist in the 2004 Olympic Marathon and had 4th place finish in the 2012 Olympic Marathon. He won the New York City Marathon in 2009 and the 2014 Boston Marathon becoming the first American to do so since 1982 and 1983 respectively.

Frank Shorter

Frank Shorter is one of the greatest distance runners of all time. He is credited with being at the forefront igniting the running boom in America in the 1970's.

Frank has competed 4 times at Bix with 2nd and 3rd place finishes. He is a 4 time US Cross Country Champion. He has a Gold medal in the 1972 Olympic Marathon and a Silver medal in the 1976 Olympic Marathon. Frank is enshrined in the US Olympic Hall of Fame, the National Track & Field Hall of Fame, and the National Distance Running Hall of Fame.



Dan Hayes

Dan Hayes, his vision and support has been instrumental in growing the Quad-City Times Bix 7 from a neighborhood run to a road race of national prominence

Hayes, former vice president of communications at Lee Enterprises and former editor of the Quad-City Times, was honored with a bronze statue on Bix Plaza to the east of the Quad-City Times in 2011. Others for whom bronze statues have been created by local artist Ted McElhiney include running legends Joan Benoit Samuelson and Bill Rodgers, Bix 7 race director Ed Froehlich, jazz musician Bix Beiderbecke and Quad-City Times columnist Bill Wundram.





A Look Back...50 Years of Running!

1975

The first Bix 7 race marked the largest gathering of runners to date in the Quad-Cities – 84. It was also the first time they were allowed to run on city streets.

The Bix was founded by John Hudetz of Bettendorf, who wanted to bring to the Quad-Cities some of the excitement he felt when he ran his first Boston Marathon in 1974.
